

Camp Outline - Peter Pan

Independent rehearsal following the rehearsal video should take at least 1 hour each day.

- ★ Warm-up everyday during the given time in video rehearsal.
- ★ Memorize and review your lines everyday.
- ★ Plan and gather the technical elements for your play everyday.

	Learn background information & synopsis.
	Explores themes and symbols in Peter Pan.

	Read through the play out loud, thinking about how you'll stage each scene. \$\neq\$ 15 Minutes
	Analyze the play, think about any themes and symbols you find, and decide how to emphasize them in your performance. ≈ 25 Minutes
	Start playing with how your characters move & speak. ≈ 20 Minutes

	Learn the rules of fight choreography.
	Block the fight.
	Learn how to start blocking.

	Slowly & Safely practice the stage kick. ≈ 10 Minutes
	Stage each scene of the play, finding and solidifying the blocking you like. ≈ 40 Minutes
Day 3	
Rehea	rsal Video <u>The Villain's Voice Peter Pan</u>
	Learn a dastardly British dialect.
	Learn how to make your own sound effects.
	Discuss operative words in the script.

	Practice Hook's dialect & other character voices. ≈ 15 Minutes
	Find operative words in your lines. Practice speaking these lines with
	operative words in mind.
	Rehearse each scene of the play, working to get multiple full run throughs
	in, and polishing any trouble spots. ≈ 30 Minutes
Day 4 - Dre	ss Rehearsal (No Scripts while running the play.)
Rehea	rsal Video - <u>Tech Day Peter Pan</u>
	Create a pirate sword.
	Create a dagger.
	Create a hook.
	Go over dress rehearsals.
Indep	endent Rehearsal
	Gather / make props. ≈ 20 Minutes
	Gather / make set pieces. ≈ 20 Minutes
	Gather / make costumes. ≈ 20 Minutes
	Combine all technical elements with your performance in a Dress
	Rehearsal. ≈ 30 Minutes
	Rehearse until you feel confident, and can run the play all the way through
	with no interruptions. ≈ 30+ Minutes
Further Re	hearsal / Performance Day
	Continue rehearsing as you see fit.
	Set up seating in your performance space.
	Break a leg*
